### FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL

“Education is what gives deliverance / emancipation”. The message of Rabindranath Tagore, “My salvation is in abundance of light”, will dawn hand in glove with the heritage in our Educational Institution. The geographical location of our educational Institution is in the verge of West Bengal’s stony soil, in the sylvan shadows of *Shal* and *Palash* and is surrounded by the culture of popular folklores. Our new family comprises the industrious boys and girls of stony hard soil of Purulia. The college that saw the light of the day on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2000, has been completed 24 excellent years of academic achievements. To achieve Higher Grade from NAAC in next cycle is our immediate objective. Besides that, by increasing the intake capacity by one-and-a-half times in 16 Major and 2 Minor disciplines and implementing postgraduate degrees, we will proceed towards sustained development, not in the evaluation of degrees, but in building a simple, easy and linear *Veda* of life, by bridging the gulf between the basic need of life and formal education. By exposing the root culture, namely ‘*Vadu Gan*’, in the arena of international symposium, we have tried to touch the indigenous culture of the soil. With a view to touching the *Jivan-Veda*, and to instilling the joyous songs of life into the heart of the new generation, we are making an effort to build up a Department of Culture, with various courses on basic culture, its assessment and performance. We are also trying to preserve, reform, develop and prevent from depravity and deformity, those cultures which are extinct and in the threshold of extinction. Special emphasis is given to the practical aspect as well to the inculcation of this passion and emotion of life in these fields. With the object of increasing the financial condition for the economically backward regions, we are moving towards promoting various schemes like kitchen garden, considering the quality and nature of soil, seed processing, different products and ingredients from *Palash Leaves*, and Honey Preservation. Keeping in view of the Vocational based learning, a scheme has been taken to introduce Nursing Training for the women of this Tribal dominated region.

For the all round and sustained development of human resources, our journey remains unhindered through Curriculum and Co-curricular activities. Our expectation: “We shall overcome someday”.

Kashipur Michael Madhusudan Mahavidyalaya, an institution for imparting undergraduate education, was founded in Kashipur (situated about 8 km away from Adra railway station and about 35 km from Purulia railway station under South-Eastern Railways) in the district of Purulia of West Bengal, on 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2000 with the sincere help and active cooperation of the people around Kashipur. In the month of September of 1872, the famous poet, Michael Madhusudan Datta took charge as the Legal Advisor to the Panchakote Raj Estate from Raja Nilmani Singh Deo of Panchakote. Later he was promoted to the prestigious office of the Treasurer. Although the tenure was not all that happy and satisfying to Madhusudan, he obtained within a short time some pleasure and interest in the life of the people living around, as well as the nature and the place itself – the evidence of which could be found in some of his sonnets. As a token of remembrance of the association between the place and the poet, the College was named “Kashipur Michael Madhusudan Mahavidyalaya”. In the course of its more than twenty-four years of glorious journey, the College has earned name, fame, and a few distinctions and hope, in the coming future it will cater to the needs of the local people of Kashipur.

## Goals, Mission and Vision of the College

The College is situated in an idyllic rural landscape of Purulia where the majority of the population is from backward communities. This region rightly falls under the jurisdiction of Jangal *Mahal*, approximately 70% of the population of the area is comprised of Scheduled Caste/Tribe people. The main obstacle to this college is the expansion of the education system in the area due to the prevailing backwardness and the lack of structural infrastructure. In such a circumstance, it was imperative to set up this college for disseminating knowledge among the local populace.

It is said that “Rome was not built in a day”. Remembering this proverb, the persistent urge made by the people of Kashipur for the establishment of the college was fulfilled and ultimately, cherished Mahavidyalaya came into being on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2000. Nestling at the heart of Kashipur, this college from its nascent stage has been offering an invaluable service regarding the spreading of educational opportunities to many prospective students and students of the comparatively unprivileged section of the district. Their opportunities determined our aims.

The **opportunities** are:

- i) To provide the students of Kashipur and adjacent area with the opportunity to enhance their educational qualification through receiving higher education and to enable them to build their capacity necessary for being effectively and gainfully employed;
- ii) To bring the local people living around in touch with various educational and social welfare services undertaken by the College through NSS or other extension activities; and
- iii) To humbly attempt to create an atmosphere of learning and awakening through the gradual spread of education and academic culture.

The College has always been receiving generous help and cooperation from the people associated with it and also from the people and well-wishers at large as well as eminent personalities of the locality. We hope and believe that this cooperation will go on increasing. We always remember with due respect those people who have touched our college with their dedicated works. They did their novel works, now it's the right time for us to continue what they left for us.

IQAC leads to visit NAAC Peer Team for its first cycle in 2016 and secured grade B. Since then,

IQAC has submitted 07 AQAR up to 2022-23. Working on AQAR for the year 2023-24 is going on. Currently the college is preparing for 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle of NAAC visit. The long-desired day of the NAAC PEER Team visit has almost been set, and the college is at present due to this enthusiastically readying itself for the second cycle of NAAC visits and for which SSR also submitted.

### **IQAC Plans for 2024-25 Academic Session:**

- Submission of Annual Quality Assessment Report (**AQAR: 2023-24**) within December 2024.
- Help the college authority to complete the **NAAC Peer Team visit** in August/September 2024 for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Cycle.
- Assessment of the **National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020)** implemented from the 2023-24 academic session as per notification from the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal following the SKBU guidelines.
- There is a plan to introduce **360-degree feedback** i.e. feedback will be taken from students (for all the semesters), teachers and non-teaching staffs, administrators and from Alumni and parents.
- **Regular interactions** with each of the 18 departments separately regarding curriculum planning, continuous evaluation, attainment of PO/CO and progress of students.
- Publish the 3<sup>rd</sup> volume of the multi-disciplinary journal **Pathachakra-3**, from the lectures of Seminars, Conference, Workshop, Special Lectures and Webinars presented by renounced teachers and research scholars.
- **Qualitative upgradation and boost up of profiles** of all the faculty members giving more emphasis on research works and publications.
- The **Centralized Admission Process** for undergraduate courses follows the directions of Higher Education Department, Govt. of W.B. through the centralized admission process of a central web portal.

### CENTRALIZED ADMISSION PORTAL (2024-25)

1. Centralized Admission Portal has been initiated for admission to undergraduate courses in the Government, Government aided General Degree Colleges / Universities in a total of 16 Universities, 461 Colleges / HEIs] across the State of West Bengal, except a few Higher Education Institutions.
2. Exclusions from the Centralized Online Admission System are Presidency University, Jadavpur University, Autonomous Colleges, Minority Colleges, B.Ed., Law, Fine Arts and Performing Arts, Crafts, Dance, Music Colleges / Courses / Programmes.

**Features:**

1. The Indian students can explore HEIs across the State, including courses, fee structure, seat matrix, eligibility criteria etc. through this portal.
2. Candidates can submit online applications through the following websites: <https://banglaruchchashiksha.wb.gov.in> or <https://wbsche.wb.gov.in> by clicking the 'Centralized Admission' tab or directly logging into this website <https://wbcap.in/>.
3. There is no application fee. An applicant can apply for a maximum of 25 programmes/ courses in one or multiple. An applicant can create a preference list of higher educational Institutions across the State, can create a preference list institution-wise and course-wise.
4. A candidate can register on the Portal after which the candidate will get a 'User ID' and Password. He/she can edit (addition/alteration) preference at any point of time until the application window closes.
5. The Merit list will be system-generated, Institution-wise/ Course-wise will be published accordingly afterwards.
6. The students can also see their merit positions for all the courses as applied for on their dashboards by logging in with their 'User ID' and password.
7. However, the student will be allotted only 01 (one) seat (higher available preference as per eligibility) and can see the same in the dashboard.
8. An admitted applicant will get the scope of upgrading to a higher position of the preference.

**Benefits of the Portal:**

1. The Portal aims to provide opportunities to the students to choose their desired courses in the desired colleges via a single window platform and to stop admission multiple times by a single student at various colleges/ Universities. In this way maximum number of seats can be filled up in all Colleges/ Universities in every academic year.
2. The unique feature of the portal is that a candidate can avail of ONLY ONE seat depending on the candidate's highest preference with the scope of up-gradation, and availability of subject and merit positions.

**Advantages of the Centralized Admission:**

1. A candidate will be able to look up courses, colleges and universities throughout the state and obtain all pertinent information, including eligibility requirements for individual courses, the number of openings, the formula for calculating the merit index, elective subjects that each college or higher education institution (HEI) offers, the profile of each college/HEIs.
2. This portal or site may also be used to pay the admissions cost.
3. If accepted, and provided there are seats available based on eligibility, a student will have the opportunity to advance to a higher preference level.
4. Just the extra sum needs to be paid using the site to be admitted to the greater preference (if applicable). Nevertheless, if the cost of the upgraded course is less, the remaining sum will be immediately reimbursed upon the conclusion of the admissions process.
5. Bill Desk and HDFC are the payment channels. further than the admission fee, there are no further fees for students to pay while utilising the payment gateways
6. If necessary, students can get assistance from "Bangla Sahayata Kendras" in filling out application forms.
7. The portal offers tutorials and user manuals to give pupils step-by-step instructions.
8. Students will receive SMS updates on their status at every stage. Additionally, the applicant will have access to the student's dashboard to view their specific status.

## Research Facilities

With the sincere efforts of the Research Cell of our College, a “Research Centre” in affiliation with Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University had been set up in the academic year 2017-18 to run the following programmes with collaboration of SKBU. Teachers from different subjects have been registered as Supervisors for the guidance of:

- Ph.D. in Bengali (2 teachers)
- Ph.D. in Economics (1 teacher)
- Ph.D. in Sociology (1 teacher)
- *The Centre will also conduct non-formal research in various disciplines. Translation of ‘Yoga-Meditation’ is one such theme project.*

## Research at the Campus

Most of the faculty members are actively engaged in research work related to their subjects. Some young faculty members are doing their Ph.D. work in different Universities. Faculties of Bengali, Economics, Geography, Chemistry and History have completed Eight (08) **Minor Research Projects** funded by UGC. Strong collaboration with different faculties of various Universities has been and is being established by our faculties. Regular research publications in various national and international journals are a usual habit of our faculties. Our faculty members usually present their research work in the various National and International conferences held in all over India and abroad also. It is a matter of proud that they are the winners of prestigious medals in all most all of those conferences.

**Research Output:** During last six academic sessions (2016-2024), 16 Books and 42 research papers have been published by the faculties in various national and international journals of considerable repute.

**Research Training:** One week Research Training Course on “Statistical Analysis using MS Excel and SPSS” has been conducted during 04.04.2022 to 09.04.2022 organized by the Department of Geography and IQAC. Several teachers have been participated in the course and benefited from the course. There will be more such programs to be organized in near future with resource persons and participants from outside the campus.

## Library as Learning Resources

We have a well-equipped and furnished library including reading room facilities. Apart from textbooks based on the syllabus of different subjects, variety of reference books, dictionaries, encyclopedias and journals are available in the library. Books and reputed journals are brought and subscribed at regular interval utilizing financial assistance available from UGC, Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal or other sources.

**(i) Reference Section:** We have general Encyclopedia like Britannica, Americana, Soviet, and Encyclopedia on various subjects, dictionaries on languages and subjects, directories, manuals, handbooks etc. and copies of most of the text books that the students need. We also subscribe to significant number of journals and about 6000+ e-journals through **INFLIBNET-NLIST**.

**(ii) Lending Section:** The library has a rich collection of more than 14,000 printed and large numbers of e-books about 31,35,000 + e-books through INFLIBNET-NLIST books on different subjects. Students are issued 1 lending cards. Against each lending card, they can borrow 2 books for 15 days. Time for issuing of books from lending section: 10.30 am - 4.30 pm.

**(iii) Reading Room:** There is a separate Reading Room section which is open from 10.00 am to 4.30 pm. Here the students can engage themselves in serious study, either using their own books or the text-books available in this section. Question papers of the Semester and Mid-Semester examinations are kept in the Reading Room, for reference.

**(iv) Computerization:** The library is partially computerized. Computerized catalogue search facility based on author / title / keyword / subject will be available for the purpose of borrowing of books very soon. Some other features of the computerization process are also being planned.

**(v) Departmental Library:** Each Department has its own separate Departmental Library. There is a

separate Book Bank for needy students of Geography Department at the Geography Laboratory.

**Library rules and regulations:**

- All Users will have to come to the college library personally to receive book on loan.
- Users can issue 2 books at a time for 15 days.
- Users can renew the book for one time.
- Books borrowed on a particular day cannot be returned in the same day.
- The books should be returned on or before the due date, if return late overdue fine will be charged.
- Readers shall not write upon, damage, or make any mark upon any book, journal or magazine, or other material belonging to the library.
- Users are instructed to check the books while issuing and they will be responsible for any type of damage or mutilation discovered at the time of return.
- If the books are lost, then the users have to replace the same books.
- Loss of card must be reported immediately to the issuing authority.

**LABORATORY FOR PRACTICAL EXPERIENCES**

The College runs several disciplines that require imparting theoretical as well as practical training to the students of the respective subjects.

- We believe that our fairly equipped laboratories of Geography, Chemistry, Zoology, Physics, and Botany are capable of catering to the academic interest of the students.
- There are also two Instrumental Laboratories for Music and Physical Educations also in the college.
- A Language Laboratory will be planned for the 2023-24 academic session with resources which will include Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Santali, and Kudmali.

### Rules for Payment of Dues

Every student must pay the monthly fee within 15<sup>th</sup> of every month, beyond which a fee of Rs. 5/- shall be charged. In case, if any student is unable to pay the fees for three consecutive months or remains absent from the College for consecutive three months, his/her name shall be struck off from the register of the College. If he/she wants re-admission, then, all the previous dues along with re-admission fees and another Rs. 5/- has to be paid.

### STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMMES

- 1) All students belonging to 'Scheduled Castes' (SC), 'Scheduled Tribes' (ST) and 'Other Backward Classes' (OBC) are eligible for obtaining scholarship from the Government of West Bengal. The students need to draw certificates from the College before applying for the scholarship to suitable authorities of the Backward Class Welfare Department. The interested students are advised to see the Notice Board for notification in this regard.
- 2) Applications from meritorious but financially challenged students are considered for granting financial support on the dual basis of 'merit' and 'means' every year. However, for those students who will have failed to secure qualifying marks in Semester Examinations (Internal Assessment and each Semester Examination) and/ or would fall short of stipulated percentage of class attendance (75% as per the rule framed by S.K.B. University) this 'support' will be withdrawn— summarily and for good. The decision by the College authority in this respect will be final and abiding.

### ➤ Scholarship & Freeship:

(A) Sri Milan Roy, a veteran NRI, kindly extended his benevolence by funding the following

scholarships to the students. Scholarships are generally awarded on the dual basis of merit and financial condition of the students. Eligible candidates are instructed to apply on notification in this regard.

- ✓ “**Maharaja Sankariprasad Singh Deo Memorial Scholarship (MSSMS)**” to be awarded to selected students who have passed from this College and currently pursuing regular UGC-approved post-graduation courses.
- ✓ “**Sampat Roy Memorial Scholarship I (SRMS-I)**” to be awarded to selected students of this College who passed Semester IV examination of the affiliating university, and have already been admitted to Semester V in this College.
- ✓ “**Sampat Roy Memorial Scholarship II (SRMS-II)**” to be awarded to selected students of this College who passed Semester II examination of the affiliating university and have already been admitted to Semester III in this College.
- ✓ “**Sampat Roy Memorial Scholarship III (SRMS-III)**” to be awarded to selected students of this College as per his/her overall performances in Internal Assessments and Cultural and Sports activities.

(B) “**Nagendra-Radharani Memorial Scholarship (NRMS)**” to be awarded to selected students of this college as per his/her overall performances in Sem II, Sem IV and Sem VI in the discipline of Philosophy.

(C) **Half Free & Full Freeship Facility:** Half Free & Full Freeship facility are available for students on the basis of merit-cum-means.

(D) College supported all the scholarships provided by West Bengal State Government including **Kanyashree, Vivekananda Scholarship (Merit-cum-Means), Chief Ministers Relief Fund, OASIS, and Aikyashree**. College also forwarded for **National Portal for Scholarship (NPS)** provided by Central Government, and two private scholarships provided by **Priyambada Birla Scholarship Fund and Jalan Scholarship Fund**.

## PROGRAMMES FOR STUDENT ENRICHMENT

### (a) Computer Laboratories & Internet Kiosk:

A separate **Computer Laboratory and Internet Kiosk** has been set up in UGC-NRC at the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor of Main Building for the academic use of the students. This remains open from 10.30 am to 4.30 pm. Apart from these; departments of **Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany, Economics and Geography** have computers for the use of students.

### (b) Online Classes:

1. An ICT class room with smart board facility has been set up for the academic use (especially for online classes) of students by the generous grant received from Govt. of West Bengal.
2. Since 16<sup>th</sup> March 2020, the College has been arranging online classes for all semesters. Google Meet, Zoom, WhatsApp, e-mail etc. are the media used by different departments. Many departments has been taking Internal Assessment via Google Forms.
3. Departments organize Special Lecture Series and Webinars where distinguished faculties of Universities/Institutes of repute can interact with the students and faculties.
4. The College, of its own, uploads all study materials for each classes in the College website([www.kashipurmmm.org](http://www.kashipurmmm.org)) on a regular basis.

### (c) Geographical Excursion:

The students (CBCS: Semester V Honours and NEP: Semester V Major) of the Department of Geography of the College go for excursion to distant places where they are exposed to landscapes, locales and habitats novel to their everyday expectations. This helps to inculcate in their minds a sense of Geography. This excursion is for the purpose of 'partial fulfillment of the curriculum' of the discipline and the cost of the touring is to be borne by the students—as per rule. However, generally, the expenditure per student is only nominal and varies from one year to another. Teacher escorts accompany the students for their guidance and supervision.

### (d) Science Excursion:

Students of Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology are encouraged to visit places of scientific relevance related to their curricula every year. Departmental teacher escorts accompany the students for their guidance and supervision.

### (e) Field Survey/ Project Work:



Regular **Field Survey** and Excursions have been conducted by the Department of Geography and Economics. As a part of the syllabus, Field Survey will be conducted for most of the SEC subjects including Economics, Sociology and Botany from the 2023-24 academic session. All the ENVS students have submitted a **Project Report** as a part of their curriculum in the first year (both in CBCS and NEP).

**(f) International and National Conference/Seminar/Workshop:**

During last seven academic years (2016 - 2024) different departments of this college has hosted 01 National Level Conference (**Economics**); organized 02 International Seminars (**Bhadu** and **Sociology**) and 06 National Seminars (**History, Philosophy, Chemistry, Economics, Sociology and English**); organized 05 Workshops (**Geography, IQAC, Teachers' Council, Women Cell**) and also organized 17 state level seminars.

By participating in these major academic events, the students of the respective departments among others could avail of the great opportunity to listen to the erudite speeches delivered by a host of reputed scholars and also to take part in the debates and discussions. The current academic year will also facilitate the students through this type of academic programmes.

**(g) International and National Webinar / Lecture Series / Observation of Important Days:**

Different departments of this college have organized International and National Webinars and several online invited lecture series during last few months. During the last four academic years (2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23, and 2023-24), **03 National Level Seminars, 06 Workshops, 29 Webinars** on various topics, **80 Special Lectures** on various topics of UG syllabus, and **14 Days of National Importance** has been observed by various departments of the college in collaboration with IQAC. Michael's 200<sup>th</sup> Birthday was observed on 25.01.2023 with a Seminar, publication of Pathachakra-I, and a rally of students and teachers. This observation also been continued throughout the year and end on 25.01.2024 with a seminar and discussion on Michael's life and work.

- ✚ Workshop for Student Credit Card has been organized in regular basis to facilitate the students of the scheme provided by the Government of West Bengal.
- ✚ Awareness on Satyendra Nath Tagore Civil Service Study Centre at SKBU under the aegis of the Government of West Bengal has been conducted in the campus.

#### **(i) Common Room and Canteen**

One boys' common room and one girls' common room and a canteen have been constructed for students' recreation, relaxation and refreshment.

#### **(j) Central Tribal Boys' Hostel**

In the vicinity of the College Building, a 100-bed Central Tribal Boys' Hostel has been opened last year. Hon'ble Sabhadhipati, Purulia Zilla Parishad formally inaugurated the hostel on 6 March 2011. This hostel was constructed with the financial assistance from the respective Backward Class Welfare Departments of the Central and State Government.

#### **(B) National Service Scheme (NSS):**

It was long since NSS had been established in this College under the auspices of the University of Burdwan and funded by the national authority of the NSS. At the moment, it has two units—Unit-I and Unit-II—of 100 volunteers each, taking 50 from each batch for every unit. The volunteers are supposed to offer their selfless service during the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Year of their College life. Generally, the duly constituted NSS Advisory Committee chooses willing male and female students who have aptitude for philanthropic and disciplined service. The volunteers are primarily guided by the NSS Programme Officers namely **Nabin Das (Unit I)** and **Debes Naskar (Unit II)** — themselves teachers of this institution— with adequate experience and training. The programmes include ‘normal activities’ like literacy training, everyday cleaning, awareness campaign on issues related to physical and moral health, personal and public hygiene, protection of environment, and a ‘special camping programme’ in some nearby village.

## RULES OF ADMISSION

- Admission for 2024-25 session will be held following the procedure of Central Admission Portal (<https://wbcap.in/>), Government of West Bengal.
- Candidates will be informed through SMS/ E-mail after publication of merit lists but in case he/she does not receive any SMS or E-mail the college authority will not remain responsible. Candidates should regularly visit the official website ([www.kashipurmmm.org](http://www.kashipurmmm.org))
- The admission process (like: form fill up, merit list, admission, fees payment etc.) will be entirely online and based on merit.
- Prospective students will not be called for any counseling or verification of documents during the process of admission. No physical presence is required at the college before the commencement of classes.
- All testimonials are required to be uploaded online during application. Verification of documents will be done only when the students report for the class in due course.
- Payment of fees (like registration fees, admission fees etc.) will be done only through e-payment and will not be deposited physically at college. Online payment may be made using debit card/credit card or through internet banking.
- As per the rules of Sidho-Kanho-Birsha University from 1<sup>st</sup> Semester onwards, students are required to study under “National Education Policy” (NEP-2020).
- The minimum qualification for pursuing Major Course is **45% strictly in H.S. (or equivalent)**. (Please check individual subject criteria given in our Website and Admission Portal while applying for Major in any subject).
- **Students must consider their subject options very carefully; for, once admitted, no change of subject will be possible.**
- Merit Lists scheduled after 1<sup>st</sup> Merit List in 12<sup>th</sup> July 2024 and so on will be published ONLY IF SEATS REMAIN VACANT after admission against 1<sup>st</sup> Merit List during the Mop-up Round in 20<sup>th</sup> August 2024.

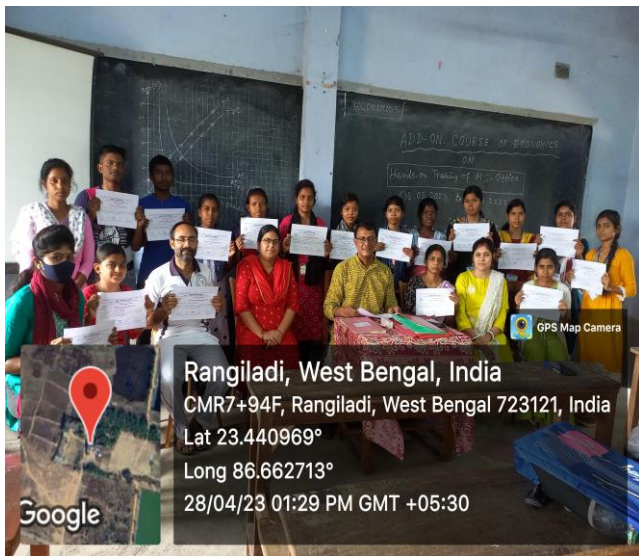
